## Home builders 2020 – who are the players and innovators?

Home building 2020 – the impact and value of using offsite construction for low rise building such as garden towns, villages and cities and larger scale developments. The gap between supply and demand currently sits somewhere between 100k and 150k homes pa. How can offsite solutions capture all of, if not the lion's share of this requirement.

Uncertainties over the short to medium term delivery of market sale homes outside of London is just beginning to emerge especially in urban conurbations. If the sector is to address shortages in housing supply it needs to ensure that this tenure remains at peak capacity, especially if we are going to see any significant growth in housing supply beyond 2020. Independent reports such as Sir Oliver Letwins publication and draft analysis which came out on the 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2018 and his final report which is due out later this year may provide some of the answers as to how future housing delivery can be increased, perhaps on the back of smaller parcels of land and additional affordable and other tenure solutions.

The impact of Build to rent and other tenures on output is already showing signs of growth, how far these can help to increase build out rates has yet to be determined. The Residential Hub will address the issues surrounding alternative delivery models as part of this session.

Support for the offsite sector has grown considerably over the past 12 months and at a disproportionate rate compared to previous years where growth was being achieved at a steady if not at times frustrating pace. Buildoffsite working with its members (from all walks of the industry) are helping the sector to understand its attributes and limitations at the same time as enabling both the public and private sectors to enter the market not only well prepared and well informed but with a network of like-minded organisations who can support them in the process.
